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# Issue: Special Considerations

**Description:** Minor formatting issue on header on Special Considerations display and Delete button navigation on Vaccination View/Add page.

**Version Affected:** 5.17.5.1

**Who Identified the Issue:** STC

**Priority:** Medium

## Steps to Test:

1. Log in to IWeb as a Registry Client user.
2. Select any organization/facility.
3. Search for and select a patient.
4. Navigate to **Vaccinations > View/Add**.
5. Click **Special Considerations**.
6. Add an exemption for the patient and click **Save**.
7. Click **Back** and navigate back to the Vaccination View/Add page.
8. BUG: Notice the red header for Exemptions is not displayed until the end.

**Expected:** Exemptions table header should be displayed until the end.

**Actual:** Exemptions table header is not displayed until the end.

9. Click the Delete button next to the exemptions you just added.
10. BUG: Notice the exemption is deleted, but the user is sent to the Special Considerations page.

**Expected:** The Special Contraindications **Delete** button on the Vaccination View/Add page should not send the user to the Special Considerations page.

**Actual:** The Special Contraindications **Delete** button on the Vaccination View/Add page sends the user to the Special Considerations page.

# Issue: Medical Exemption

**Description:** The Medical Exemption Request page is not aligned while editing contraindication vaccines.

**Version Affected:** 5.17.5.1

**Who Identified the Issue:** STC

**Priority:** Low

## Steps to Test:

1. Log in to IWeb.
2. Search for and select a patient.
3. Navigate to the Vaccination View/Add page.
4. Select Medical Exemption.
5. Select a vaccine, a contraindication reason (choose any length of text), and other required fields.
6. Add a vaccine.
7. Click the **Edit** icon.
8. BUG: The page is displayed outside of the margins.

**Expected:** The page is displayed within the margins.

**Actual:** The page is displayed outside of the margins.

A contraindication is a condition in a recipient that increases the risk for a serious vaccine adverse event (SAE) or compromises the ability of vaccine to produce immunity. A precaution is a condition in a recipient that might increase the risk for a serious VAE or the might compromise the ability of the vaccine to produce immunity. Under normal conditions, vaccinations are deferred when a precaution is self-limiting, but can be administered if the precaution condition improves.

# Issue: Patient Detail Report

**Description:** In Scheduled Reports, the Patient Detail is missing the expression in the Patient Report Accessor.

**Version Affected:** 5.17.5.1

**Who Identified the Issue:** STC

**Priority:** Low

## Set up:

- Local Approver Organization (IRMS) has the Allow Online Orders option enabled. (This is supposedly a requirement when adding a County View user account, although it looks like the requirement is not enforced when the user is saved.)
- County View user points to the above LHJ, has an email address, and has all permissions except the Block permissions.
- At least one patient is owned by the above LHJ.

## Steps to Test:

1. Log in to IWeb as the above County View user.
2. Go to **Reports > Reports Module > Patient Detail**.
3. Select the above LHJ and generate a report.
4. Verify the above patient is returned.
5. Go to **Reports > Reports Module > Patient Detail** and start to schedule the above report.
6. Select the above Local Approver Organization (IRMS) as a report parameter and schedule a report.
7. Receive the email and click on the link.
8. Log in as the above County View user.
9. Go to the **Scheduled Reports > Received Reports** page.  
**Expected:** The Patient Detail Report is listed on the page.  
**Actual:** The Patient Detail Report is not listed on the page.
10. Repeat this test with the same user. This time, do not select an IRMS.
11. Notice the same error behavior occurs.
